CURRENT CHALLENGE

We genuinely wish to transition from renting a building to acquiring a piece of land that offers essential building & living resources. With soil rich in clay for bricks, a well for water, and access to power, we could construct our own buildings, saving money on these resources for life. Also, in Uganda, it is culturally important to own land when a family member passes away, as they must be buried or cremated there; otherwise, the body is placed in a mass grave. This situation raises our deep concerns for the future, motivating us to purchase land for this reason. A small piece of land is about \$5500, and all of our extra funds are put into a savings account for this purpose.
