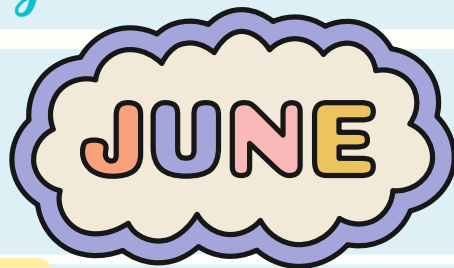

Volunteer Spotlight



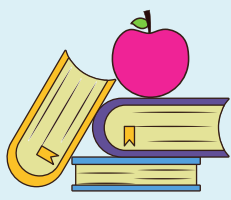
Takeeto Hannington

Malaria Season



Malaria is a significant public health concern in Uganda, where it is endemic and a leading cause of illness and death. The country experiences high transmission rates, particularly during the rainy seasons when mosquito breeding is most active. Efforts to combat malaria in Uganda include the distribution of insecticide-treated mosquito nets, indoor residual spraying, and public health campaigns to raise awareness and promote preventive measures.



At Happy Hüt Sanctüary, we are aiming to reduce the risk of bites to our children with long sleeves, pants, and new mosquito nets!

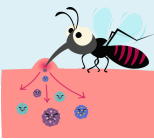
Current Challenge

Our current challenges are still to fill the Happy Tum mies Club with Donors at \$15 per month. We need **14 more donors** to fill the club and cover our current monthly food costs. **We were able to secure 5 nets so far, and still need 21 more new mosquito nets**, to protect our children from malaria during their resting times.

We currently care for 65 children, who sleep 2–3 per bunk bed. To fully protect them, we need approximately 23 new mosquito nets, one for each bed. Our current nets are three years old, and they should be replaced yearly to be most effective. Each new net costs \$14.

We invite you to take part in this urgent and life-saving effort by signing up to feed a child's tummy, and protect them with a new sleeping mosquito net for one of our beds this rainy month. Your contribution will help us keep our children safe, healthy, full, and resting peacefully at night.
